# This Month's Meeting

### Wednesday, February 15th, 6:45 pm

Eno Hall, Hopmeadow Street, Simsbury

This meeting is our service meeting where we will be working on an ABC quilt and neonatal quilts. Both of these are projects are for the whole guild to participate in; this is our way of sharing our wonderful talents with the wider community. If everyone could make one quilt for the neonatal project and one block for the ABC quilt this year, it would be a fantastic year!

For the neonatal quilts, we will be sewing labels on the quilts that members have already donated to the guild. These are donated to the NICU at UConn-Dempsey Hospital in Farmington. So for this you need to bring hand sewing tools like needle, thread, scissors and a thimble. Also, if you have any fabric to donate that would be suitable for baby quilts please bring that to the meeting.

We will have kits available for making a block or more for the next ABC quilt. So please bring equipment for machine sewing like a seam ripper, scissors, pins, neutral thread and a portable sewing machine with cords and bobbins if possible. There will be at least 4 sewing machines available at Eno. We need 42 blocks for each quilt, so let's see if we can get a lot made at this meeting!

Fabric donations...we are in need of traditional colors (red, blue, green gold, beige, brown); good quality fabric and no florals. Please bring donations to the meeting.


